The <u>Australasian College of Dermatologists (ACD)</u> is very pleased to announce that Haley Bennett has been appointed as Chief Executive Officer, commencing 1st February 2022 upon the retirement of current CEO Tim Wills.

Haley is currently Deputy CEO of the College and previous Acting CEO in 2020. Over the past 5 years, she has led significant growth and innovation across the College including leading development of College's <u>Strategic Plan 2020-23</u>, considerably increasing College's relationships and partnerships with government, health organisations, community, advocacy and patient groups, and leading College's member service response to COVID-19.

Haley has extensive and international experience in health across sectors - in health policy and service delivery, strategy, communications, stakeholder engagement and research. Commencing her career in the academic sector, Haley received a PhD from the Garvan Institute of Medical Research and held a post-doctoral position at the Beatson Institute for Cancer Research in Glasgow, UK. Haley has since held numerous roles in medical communications, in the not-for-profit sector and at Cancer Australia, the Federal Government's agency for cancer control, before joining ACD in 2016.

ACD President Dr Clare Tait said Dr Bennett was extremely well placed to lead the College as it continues to work towards its vision for the highest standard of skin health and dermatology care to be available and accessible to all patients and communities.

"Bringing together excellent governance, operations and financial management skills, Haley has an exceptional ability to communicate and a thorough knowledge and experience of the regulatory, membership and external stakeholder landscape. Highly collaborative, she has the trust and respect of the Board who have worked closely with her over the last few years.
